Are you 55 or older and looking for a job?

Employers value the skills and experience older workers bring to the workplace. The SCSEP program can help low-income adults 55 or older refresh their job skills and re-enter the workforce.

What is SCSEP? (Pronounced SEE-SEP)

The Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP) is sponsored by the Georgia Department of Human Services, Division of Aging Services (DAS). At SCSEP, we believe that achieving the American Dream is possible for everyone, regardless of age. SCSEP assists low-income older adults (55+) through a training program designed to help them find employment and provide services to the community. Funding for SCSEP comes from the U.S. Department of Labor under Title V of the Older Americans Act.

How does the program work?

Eligible individuals are enrolled part-time at a nonprofit community agency where they receive:

- Job skills training that matches their employment interests
- Employment-related counseling and job hunting assistance

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Who is eligible?

- Age 55 years or older
- Unemployed
- Family income of no more than 125% of the federal poverty level
